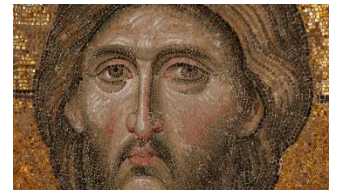

Gospel Reflection: John 17:20-26

Jesus frequently explains the tenderness of God, his close relationship with him, and the way that God loves us – like a forgiving father or a patient gardener. In this passage we hear Jesus' desire for his followers to know and believe in the powerful love of God for them. Some people experience that love vividly and have no trouble believing it. Others struggle to believe that they deserve this kind of tender care.

Who are we in Jesus Christ? This Scripture reading teaches us that we are called into union with God the Father, through Jesus Christ. By Christ's salvific act we are able to join with God and have God's life in us. Jesus shares with us the glory that the Father gave to him. Jesus requests that the Father's love for him, which was present before earth creation, be in all his children.

What do you think would happen if all Christians on every continent actually joined together to fulfill Christ's prayer? Who would go hungry if everyone shared what they had? Who would go without shelter if everyone opened up their homes? Who would be poor if all of the money spent on wars and weapons was instead used for the good of those in need? If every Christian did as Christ commanded us to do, if we joined together as one body, we could witness to the entire world the power of God's love. What about you? This week reflect on your role in this. Look for signs of God's love for you this week.

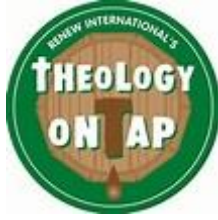

Catholic Social Ministry: The Church in the U.S. Today

New World Tavern, Plymouth

Fr. J. Bryan Hehir serves as the Secretary for Social Services for the Archdiocese of Boston. He is also the Parker Gilbert Montgomery Professor of the Practice of Religion and Public Life at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. Hehir was formerly a faculty member at Georgetown University and at the Harvard Divinity School.

In Washington D.C., he served on the staff of the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops (1973-92) working on issues of foreign policy and domestic policy, including being the staff director of the Catholic Bishops pastoral letter ("The Challenge of Peace" – 1983). From 2002-2003 he was President of Catholic Charities USA, the nationwide network of social service agencies for the Catholic church in the United States. In the Archdiocese of Boston, Fr. Hehir represents Cardinal O'Malley to four social service agencies and also serves as a liaison to Catholic health systems in the Archdiocese. He was a member of the Vatican Delegation to the United Nations (1973 and 1978). At HKS he is a Faculty Associate at the Carr Center for Human Rights and at the Safra Center for Ethics and the Professions. His teaching, research and writing focus on ethics and foreign policy and the role of religion in world politics and in American society.

Father Hehir will speak to us about social ministry and how Catholic social teaching is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. Catholic social teaching is built on a commitment to the poor, a commitment that arises from our experiences of Christ in the Eucharist. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren."

"Take your everyday, ordinary life - your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life, and place it before God as an offering.

Work becomes worship when you dedicate it to God and perform it with an awareness of His presence."
